Comments: The creative class is core to not just our local economy but also the city's very identity. The actors, artists, dancers, and musicians give the city a unique cultural vibrancy that attracts people from all over the world to visit Nashville and support our local economy. The creative professionals in our city create job opportunities for other creative professionals, as well as those in hospitality and marketing. As Mayor, I'll work closely with Metro Arts and am committed to investing in the arts and doing-so with equity in mind.

Artists, yes, but also cops, firefighters, and school teachers are finding it increasingly difficult to afford to live here. While at MDHA we brought together the public sector and the private sector to form public-private partnerships and resulted in thousands of new units of affordable housing. As Mayor I will look to continue that approach.
