Artists are chosen for *Periscope Nashville* through a competitive application process and scored by a panel of community reviewers that includes leading artists, curators, musicians, and creative entrepreneurs in Nashville's arts, culture and business sectors. Selected artists participate in nine weeks of entrepreneurial training followed by six months of individualized mentorship with high-caliber business mentors. The program culminates at the Periscope Pitch + Artist Entrepreneur Showcase in September where artist entrepreneurs unveil their creative businesses to the community.

The 24 artist entrepreneurs selected for the Periscope Class of 2025 represent a diverse cross-section of our artistic community," said Jonathan Harwell-Dye, Director of Programs at the Arts & Business Council. "Over the next several months, they will have the chance to develop their creative business plans and pitch their businesses to garner the resources and partnerships essential for future growth."
